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Home Again, Home Again, Jiggidy Jigg. sorta.... redux

With the closing of Camp Bowers, Klahican Lodge had no place to call home. So we went on the move, a World Tour, if you please. Our first stop was in Tabor City, Columbus County September 15-17th at Jellystone Park at Daddy Joe's. Our January Fellowship scheduled for the 12-14th was to be in the Sipo-Kittahikan chapter area but the location was not available. The folks at Daddy Joe's were kind enough to invite us back, so we went.

In March 9-11, 2007, we were at McCoy Pond at Glenlivet farm in Scotland County, where we began the serious planning for the SR-7B Conclave in April 2008. Our Summer Fellowship/Ordeal was May 18-20, 2007 at the Thomas Property in Pender County. Camp Bowers was open for the summer but is currently closed for renovations to the dining hall and final landscaping. So we visited Camp McNeill in September for those of you who don't know, that's on the left as you drive into Camp Bowers. We had a great weekend and inducted 103 new Ordeal members and 13 new Brotherhood members.

Now it is time for the Winter Fellowship, chili competition, more conclave planning, cold weather camping and good fun.

If you were inducted into the Order at least ten months ago, you are eligible to seal your membership in the Order through the Brotherhood Ceremony this weekend. The necessary forms are on page 7. You must sign up and let us know you are coming because we are expecting a large crowd and we must prepare in order to provide a great experience for all. So, make plans to attend. Oh, did I forget to tell you when – January 11-13, 2008.

READ THIS NOW:

Because of increased costs of food and rental fees for camp use, Klahican Lodge has found it necessary to increase the fees for our weekends. Fees for a Fellowship will be \$30.00. This will include a Friday and Saturday night cracker-barrel, three meals on Saturday and one on Sunday. Brotherhood will be \$50.00 and includes the cost of a new sash and flap. A major reason for the increase is the number of members who do not sign up for the weekend in time to be counted in the food purchase, but show up unannounced. This results in the cook crew having to make extra food purchases at retail prices. **To offset this cost and offer a special price to those who pre-register, we will be offering an "Early Bird" price to those who register by Wednesday @ 5pm. 2007 Redhawk's Gathered Nations Pow Wow in King, North Carolina.

Joey Dupuis of Venturing Crew 2206 and Brotherhood member of Klahican Lodge has, for a second time, managed to bring honor and recognition to the Lodge for the aid rendered at the Pow Wow. Two groups brought together by Joey provided the aid given. The first group was Three Fires Chapter, Robbie and Bob Bolin, and Corbett Holden. The second group included close friends and family of Joey, Audrey Williamson also of Crew 2206, her younger brother Grainger, Sandy Brown, Hadley Chase, and Joey's twin James of Calabash Volunteer Fire Department. Former Camp Bowers Staffer Matt McCarley was kind enough to lend Joey his van for transportation.

Joey's responsibilities were simple yet demanding. The first of the three tasks that was accepted was water duty for the Elders, Veterans, Singers, and Dancers. About nine hundred pounds of ice and six hundred bottles of water were distributed during the three-day Pow Wow while temperatures stayed between 95 and 104 degrees. The second task was the most daunting task. He was also a Fire Keeper. During the three days of the Pow Wow, it was up to Joey to keep the fire lit. He did so with six hours of sleep for the entire weekend. On Friday afternoon the skies opened up and rain fell upon the grounds. Joey and Grainger saved the Pow Wow by keeping the fire dry with a tarp. If the fire goes out at a Pow Wow then it is over. The last task was trash detail. While not the most pleasant smelling job it was also an important task. About sixty fifty-five gallon trash bags were full and carefully disposed of. Brad Bennett spoke of Servant Leadership and there is hardly a better example than the work that was done during that blistering hot weekend.

Perhaps the most important influence of Joey's in preparation of the Pow Wow, was his involvement in and knowledge of Scouting. Lance Redhawk and Dawn asked him for help. Joey explained to them that the Boy Scouts and, more specifically, the Order of the Arrow are valuable resources that would gladly help to preserve the Native American culture. It was for the reason that Klahican Lodge was asked, through Joey, for help. Joey spoke to Joe, Mason and Kevin Pedzwater, along with Tim Hinson and Brad Bennett about arranging for help and spreading the word. Joey's influence with Lance Redhawk and Dawn could be best noted when he suggested that they find the District Executive for the area, Steven Simpson. Because of the networking eight local scout troops attended along with two units from Cape Fear Council (Audrey and Joey plus the Arrowmen of troop 201).

Lance Redhawk last year was given the highest accolade possible by the Iroquois: he was told the he could return home to the Reservation whenever he wanted to. This year he was gifted a bison skull. In addition to that he was also received a Regalia shirt from David Macintire, a Mohawk who traveled all the way from Canada to attend the Pow Wow. Klahican was to be rewarded too. The Lodge will be presented four ceremonial chokers (valued at \$240) at the soonest possible Lodge Function.

The groups that attended were able to hear several great stories, learn and participate in the dancing during the proper time, try authentic native foods (yeah buffalo), and see different types of dancing and their histories. There were also several vendors there that shared their craft and sold goods. There was even a Tipi raffle (valued at \$900).

Editor's Note:

The next pages are important. As you know, Klahican Lodge is hosting the SR-7B Conclave in April of 2008. It is necessary that you read these pages and use them NOW if we are to have a successful conclave.

Immediately behind this page are two forms - one for registration to attend the conclave. The deadline on the form is March 30, 2008, but you need to make the commitment to your lodge now and send in the form so that we can plan our committees. We need every member of the lodge (485) present and working to make the conclave a success. The second form is an order form for our staff memorabilia. If you sign up for conclave you will receive a delegate patch, a host/staff patch and a Klahican conclave flap. The delegate patch has a red arrow (see the Conclave 2008 Delegate Memorabilia Form which also includes a Host Lodge Patch w/Yellow Arrow). Our host/staff patch will have a white arrow and will only be available to staff (us). Note the deadline for ordering extras of these two patches -January 15,2008, the same date as for the regular Conclave memorabilia. This is because we must place an order with the vendors for these patches and manufacturing times are about six weeks.

Next is the Conclave Delegate Medical Form. This form is mandatory to attend the conclave. Send it in with your registration. Do Not Send In Your Regular Summercamp Type Form. This is the one we must have.

Next is the Conclave 2008 Delegate Memorabilia Form. Read it over and order lots of stuff. After all, it will be at least six years before we host the event again.

Finally, it is my sad duty to impart the following news:

If the date by your name on the address label is 08/07, the time has come for us to say goodbye. This will be the last **Nendawen** mailed to your address. The lodge can only afford to send information to its dues paying membership.

We have really enjoyed knowing you and have appreciated your support in the past and now that our time together is over we will miss you. Especially since we really need your support for the conclave. If you are still active in Scouting and wish to continue as a member of Klahican Lodge, please send in your \$15.00 dues to the office and we will welcome you back among us. If you are still active in Scouting but do not wish to belong to the Lodge, we ask that you remove the Klahican Lodge Flap from your uniform so that others will know that you are not a member. Please inform your Scoutmaster of your decision. He will want to know why you are not wearing the flap.

Again, we have enjoyed your membership and hate to see you leave but it's your decision and we will abide by it.
